# Acceptable Guy's School Attire

## Nonacceptable Guy's Attire

Sheer shirts, tight, form-fitting clothes, tank tops/undershirts, any pants with writing across the buttocks, any clothing not covering the midriff, any clothing that is frayed, torn, or dirty in appearance, pajama-type clothing, at no time should undergarments be exposed, any other clothing deemed inappropriate by school administration

Modest skirts at

- Dress or skirt. Length (when standing or sitting) is to be no more than 2 inches above the bend in the back of the knee. This includes slits, which are not to be pinned to make them more acceptable.
